- * 80% of Questions in a paper are to be answered compulsorily in Sanskrit with Devanagari script in 3rd and 4thSemester(2nd Year).
- * 100% Questions in a paper are to be answered compulsorily in Sanskrit with Devanagari script in 5th to 8thSemester(3rd Year & 4th Year).
